DAY ONE (AFTERNOON ARRIVAL)

AFTERNOON ADVENTURES:

- Explore the Historic Arkansas Museum, a preserved block of Little Rock's oldest neighborhood and learn about the territorial history of Arkansas through exhibits and living-history characters in the heart of downtown.

EVENING EXCURSIONS:

- Enjoy a show at Murry's Dinner Playhouse. In business since 1967, Murry's combines buffet style-dinner with lively performances of stage shows, Broadway musicals and more.

DAY TWO

MORNING MOMENTS:

- Visit the nation's only high school that operates within a national park, Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site. See the role the Little Rock Nine played in the desegregation of America's public schools.
- Explore the lives of women through the 20th Century as told by their purses at one of only three museums in the world dedicated to women's handbags — Esse Purse Museum.
- Celebrate the culture, community, achievements and history of African Americans in Arkansas at Mosaic Templars Cultural Center.

AFTERNOON ADVENTURES:

- Walk in the footsteps of our 42nd president as you explore the William J. Clinton Presidential Center and Park. Enjoy Lunch at 42 bar and table, the Center's on-site restaurant, with gourmet menus and an exceptional bar on the banks of the Arkansas River.
- Explore Heifer International's world headquarters and their mission to end poverty and hunger. Check out hands-on exhibits showing real world challenges and what people are doing to solve them. Bonus: you might even see an alpaca!
- Take a tour and tasting at Rock Town Distillery, Arkansas's first legal distillery since Prohibition.

EVENING EXCURSIONS:

- Dine at Cache, a casual yet elegant dining venue in the heart of Little Rock's River Market District. Enjoy your meal on the second-floor balcony and take in the view of the Arkansas River, Riverfront Park and the surrounding areas.
- Indulge in a nightcap at Agasi 7, the rooftop bar overlooking the Arkansas River at the Hilton Garden Inn Downtown Little Rock.

DAY THREE

MORNING MOMENTS:

- Visit the birthplace of General Douglas MacArthur at MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History.
- Explore a WWII-era tugboat that cleared ships out of harm's way during the attack on Pearl Harbor and a submarine that was present in Tokyo Bay for the Japanese surrender at the Arkansas Inland Maritime Museum.
- Picture yourself in the Antebellum South at North Little Rock's The Old Mill, featured in the opening credits of "Gone with The Wind."

AFTERNOON ADVENTURES:

- Take a bite of local cuisine at Bill Clinton's "unofficial campaign headquarters," Doe's Eat Place.
- Tour the site of President Clinton's presidential acceptance speeches and enjoy the extensive exhibits at the Old State House Museum.
- See the home where President Clinton lived when he led the state at the Arkansas Governor's Mansion.

EVENING EXCURSIONS:
